BIG THINGS ARE HAPPENING ON WEST MARKET



It's an exciting time here at The Healing Place. The expansion of our Men's Campus is going up quickly at 10th and Market. The \$29 million project got underway in January. Phase One is expected to be complete by the end of the year with the entire project wrapping up by January 2019.

The expansion comes at a time when our Men's Detox is turning

away an average of 300 men every month because of a lack of space. The new facility will double the size of detox and add nearly 200 beds to our long-term recovery program.

We have raised 77% of the funds needed for this project and we are so grateful to the Louisville community for its incredible support.

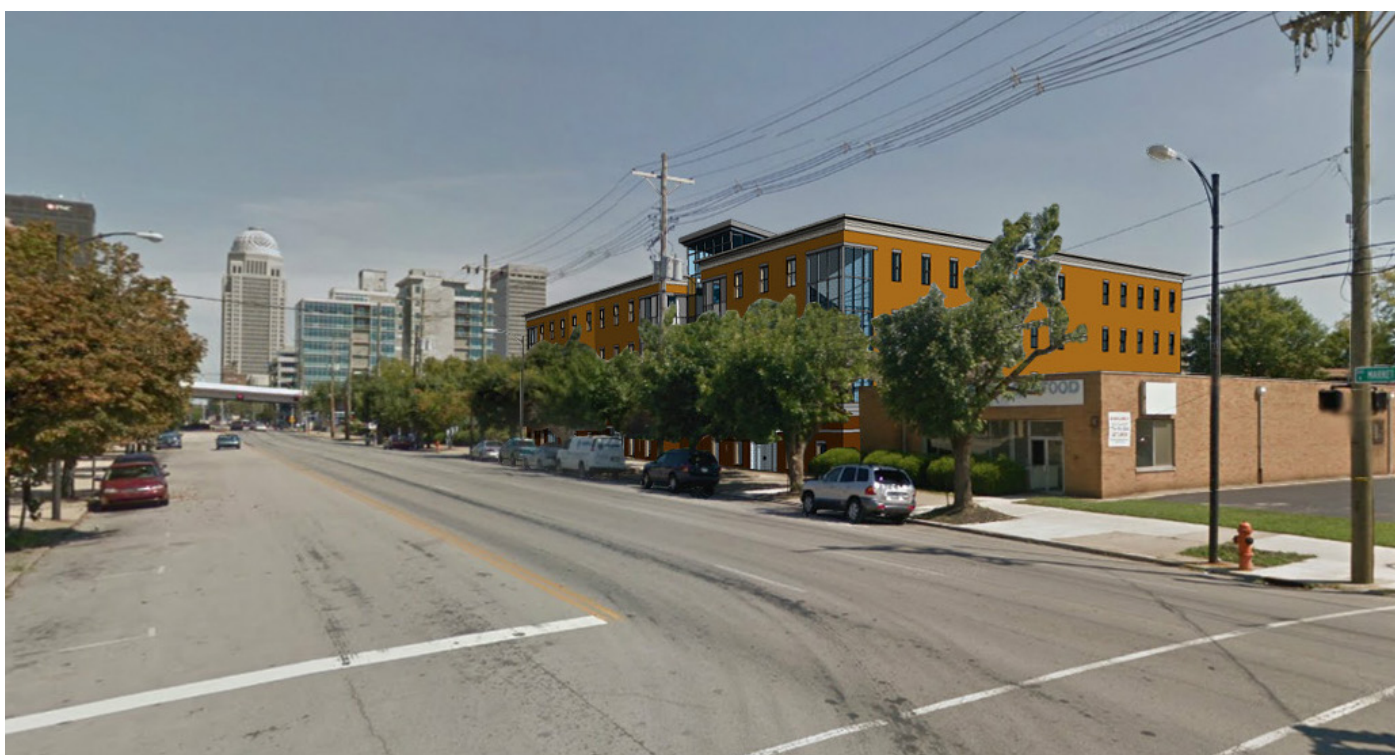

Celebrate Freedom Award

This year's Celebrate Freedom Award was presented to Louisville Mayor Greg Fischer, Louisville Metro Government, and Louisville Metro Council.

In addition to tens of thousands of dollars in program support every year, the Mayor and Metro Council allocated \$1,120,000 for the expansion of our Men's Campus.

Chief of Public Services Doug Hamilton and Metro Corrections Director Mark Bolton accepted the award on behalf of the Mayor and the City while Metro Council President David Yates accepted on the Council's behalf.



FLOAT FOR RECOVERY

The average age of men and women seeking help at The Healing Place is getting younger and many of them fear that they will not be able to have fun without drugs or alcohol. Float for Recovery is proof that it is possible.

Over the past two years, nearly 2,000 people have packed Falling Rock Park in LaGrange, KY for a day of sober fun. The Float for Recovery brings together men and women in recovery from all over the country.

This event, started by a group of our alumni, has raised \$25,000 for The Healing Place to date. Plans for Float for Recovery 3 are already underway for Summer 2018.

There are multiple components of Recovery Louisville that interact closely with each other. Our philosophy of treatment recognizes the totality of the individual in his or her

life situation. This includes cognitive behavior therapy, 12-Step facilitation, motivational interviewing, and support for the family.

Our services are designed to facilitate time management, increase accountability and develop life skills. After the initial assessment by our licensed staff, a personalized treatment plan will be developed to meet client's individual needs.

The Healing Place has begun drug testing our residential clients. This has proven to be a very valuable process for us.

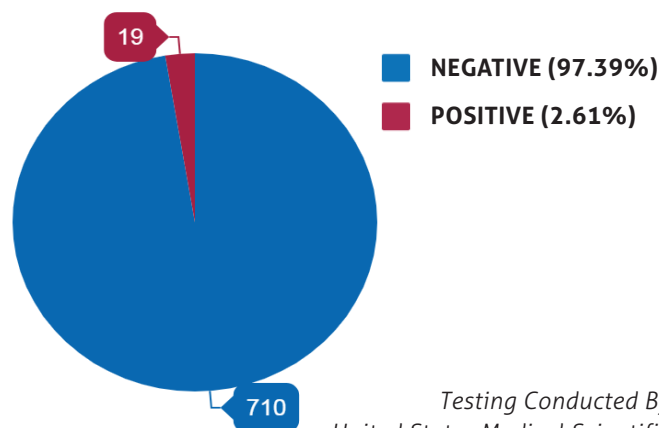
While we believed that our clients were remaining free from drugs and alcohol while in our facilities, we wanted to independently validate those beliefs. We began a partnership with a local laboratory and are very

pleased with the results we have received. After the first quarter of testing, only three percent of the clients returned a positive test.

Programmatically, accountability is a vital factor in The Healing Place recovery program. It is also very important to share the results with the

individual clients, to support them in their efforts to remain drug and alcohol free. For donors, it is affirming to know that our efforts are effective.

Our staff has a renewed confidence not only in the clients, but in the recovery process itself.



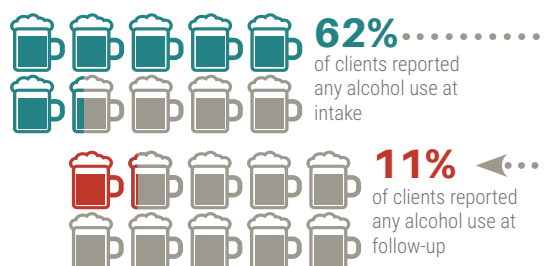
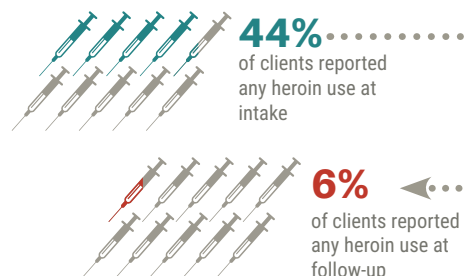
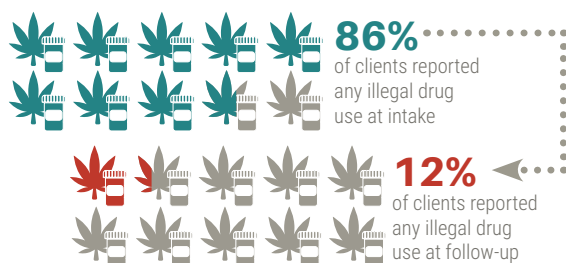

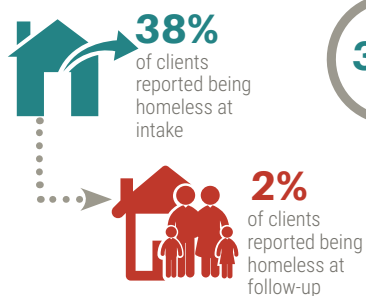
RECOVERY CENTER OUTCOME STUDY FACT SHEET - JANUARY 2017

Recovery Kentucky was created to help Kentuckians recover from substance abuse, which often leads to chronic homelessness. Fourteen of the currently established Recovery Kentucky programs¹ participated in the Recovery Center Outcome Study between July 2014 and June 2015.

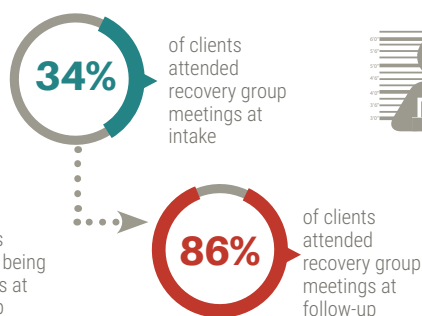
SIGNIFICANT REDUCTIONS IN PAST-6-MONTH SUBSTANCE USE

Using national estimates of the cost of substance abuse and applying them to clients' substance use before and after program participation, there was an estimated \$2.71 return in avoided costs for every dollar invested in providing recovery services.

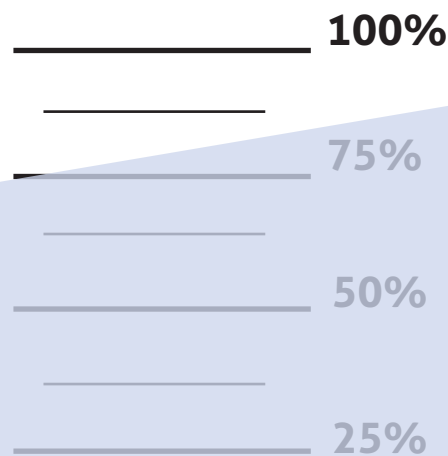
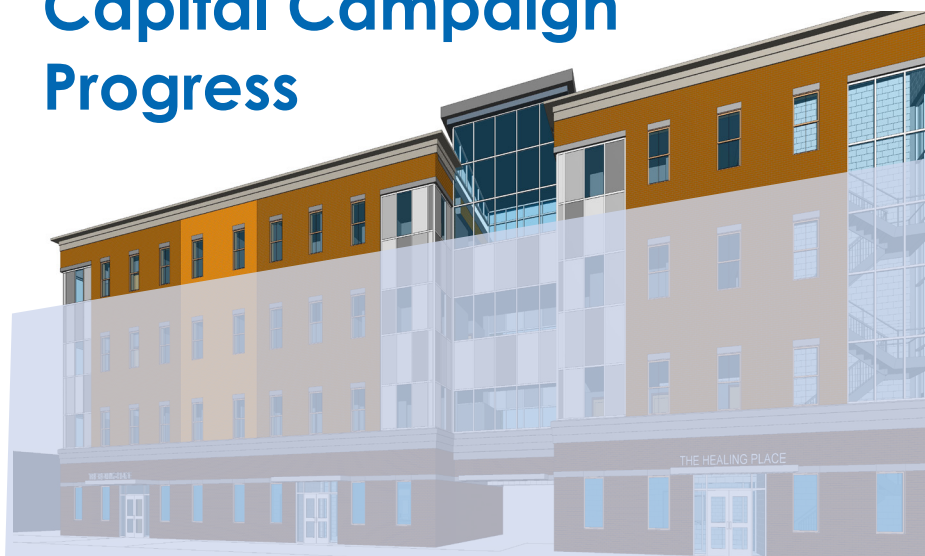
